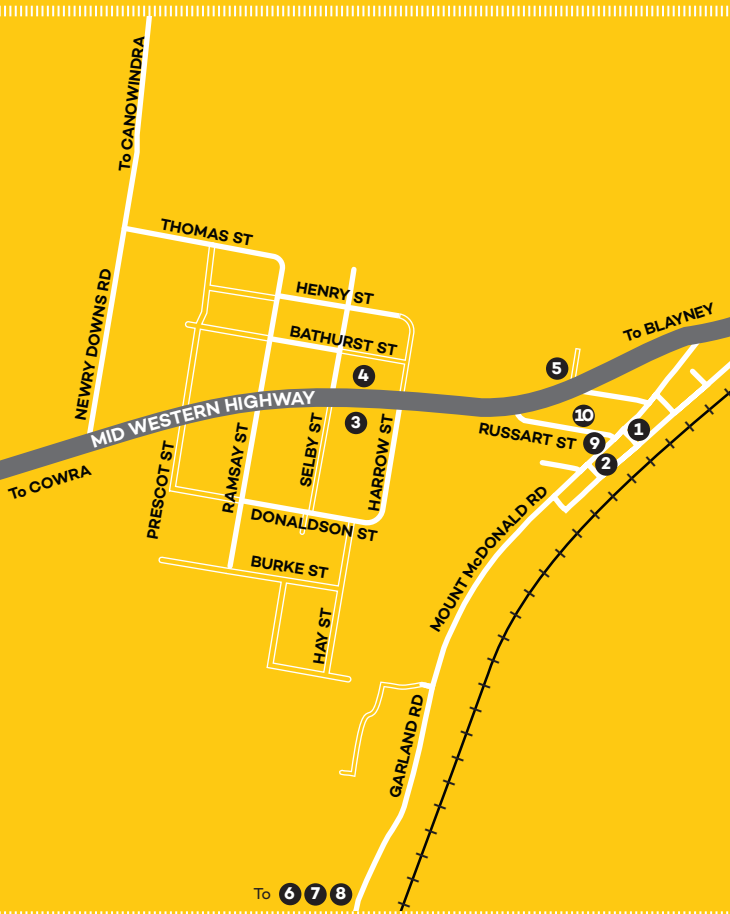

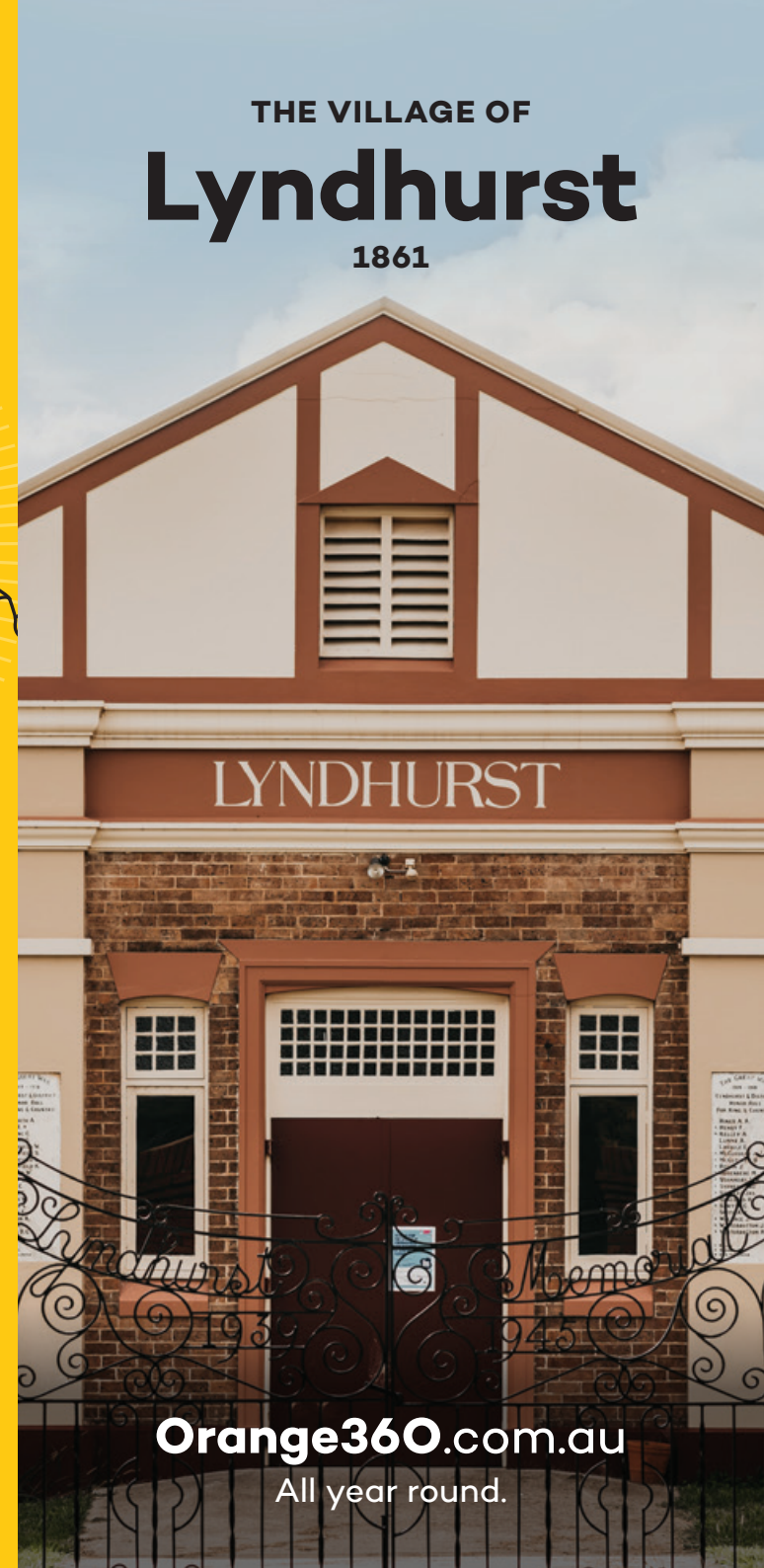

The village of Lyndhurst

With a population of about 250 locals, Lyndhurst residents enjoy the tranquillity of country life with cultural and recreational activities on its doorstep. Home to the oldest rifle club established in 1913 Lyndhurst Rifle Club, which hosts teams of rifle experts with accolades from around the World. The Public School remains a centre of activities for families. The Royal Hotel is the hub of the village and the Lyndhurst Take Away serves some of the best food and coffee around. The Autoport is conveniently located for fuel and supplies and Lyndhurst Soldiers Memorial Hall is a community meeting place.

History

First established in 1861 and later proclaimed a village in 1885, Lyndhurst is rich in history. Famous for the discovery of gold at Junction Reefs which created Lyndhurst as the hub of services to the people in the goldfields. The town prospered during the late 1800s and at one stage boasted three banks, three general stores, a cinema, pubs, professional photographer, farrier, baker, fruit shop, butcher, three garages, a wheelwright, a tank building, railway station, a memorial hall and showground.

Team Penning

Lyndhurst Team Penning is growing in popularity and continues to attract competitors and visitors from near and far to join in the fun of this family day out. Held at the local Golf Course, team penning is a horse sporting event for all ages. The aim is to work together to pen three head of cattle with assigned coloured collars from a mob within an allocated time. Area sorting involves the team to cut out the correct cattle and drive them back to the pen while holding back the wrong cattle. Regular events are held throughout the year.

RV Friendly

As an 'RV friendly' town, a warm welcome awaits for visitors to take a break at the Lyndhurst Sports & Recreation Ground with its new primitive campground facilities for motor homes and caravans who can enjoy lunch or dinner and meet the locals at the Royal Hotel or local café.

Annual Events

Lyndhurst Community Market Day – held annually in October for local market stalls, bands, car shows.

Team Penning – regular events held at the Lyndhurst Golf Course throughout the year including March, May and November. Check the website or Facebook for details.

Carcoar Cup Running Festival is held in the neighbouring village of Carcoar every November. Events include a children's dash, half marathon, marathon and ultra-marathon throughout some of the most picturesque country scenery in the area.

SURROUNDING AREA

- Visit the neighbouring historic villages of Mandurama, Neville and Carcoar.
- Visit the Japanese Gardens, POW camp and memorial and restaurants in Cowra 43 kilometres down the highway.
- Travel to Canowindra 49 kilometres away to see the beautiful, bright yellow canola fields, go ballooning, discover the fossils at the Age of Fishes Museum.
- Take the boat, have a picnic or go fishing at one of the scenic dams in the area including Carcoar Dam and wind farm a short 17 kilometres drive or Wyangala Dam just 44 kilometres.
- Take an easy 53 kilometres drive for a day trip to the enchanting Abercrombie Caves.
