7. NEW BUSINESS

Item 1 – Discussion on Future of Bells Line Expressway Group

I Armstrong opened discussions and noted the work done on the Bells Line of Road at Bilpin is good, but the road across Newnes Plateau is still dangerous. Noted development and growth occurring at Windsor, and the potential of a Western Sydney airport.

P Thompson spoke of money still being spent on Bells Line of Road. Supports the retention of the group.

B West noted the lack of traction of the Group recently has been disappointing. Noted CENTROC is pushing in this area, lobbying etc.

R Bailey noted recent difficulties, low meeting numbers, and infrequent meetings. If BLEG is to continue, need to refocus.

I Armstrong noted Group has been good in keeping the Government aware of issue. Put forward suggestion that it is time to let CENTROC take over the lobbying.

P Thompson feels the Group must continue on and keep pushing the issue. Perhaps we should invite the Minister for Roads, Maritime & Freight, The Hon. Duncan Gay MLC, to meetings.

B West agreed with P Thompson's comments. It is difficult to make a decision on future of BLEG with low attendance at this meeting. Suggested we should send a letter to BLEG members to ask them what they would like to do. Also need to get industry involved, such as the trucking industry and transport.

R Bailey recalled the original BLEG brochure which included many industries and organisations support. We need to ask if they are still interested and willing to be involved.

I Armstrong advised BLEG will send a letter to industries and original members of BLEG asking if they will continue to support BLEG.

A **MOTION** was **MOVED** R Bailey and **SECONDED** P Thompson

RESOLVED: That a letter be sent to original committee members, tourism and transport industries, CENTROC and OROC seeking support on the future of BLEG. Once a response has been received, call a meeting.

STAFF TO CONTINUE TO PROVIDE SERVICES AT REGIONAL STATIONS

Minister for Transport and Infrastructure Andrew Constance has today announced that NSW TrainLink will continue to staff eight stations it had proposed to unattend.

Blayney, Broken Hill, Griffith, Macksville, Nambucca Heads, Parkes, Wellington and Yass Junction Stations will continue to be staffed to meet the needs of local customers.

“I want to ensure these stations remain well maintained assets for future generations, and as a result, we’ll be continuing to staff these locations,” Mr Constance said.

“We also want to think outside the square as to how these stations and available space could be better utilised for the whole community, whether it’s for rail heritage, coffee shops or meeting rooms.

“There are boundless opportunities to ensure these regional stations are not just transport hubs to get from A to B, but a hub that the whole community can enjoy.

“Customers can be reassured that there will be no changes to train and coach timetables at these stations. We’ll be maintaining staff to cover the arrival and departure of major services, while on-board staff will continue to assist the elderly and people with disability.

“Security will also be enhanced at these stations, with new CCTV cameras and/or Customer Help Points providing 24/7 assistance.

“Each of these stations play an important part in the local community and the NSW Government is pleased to confirm they will continue to provide services well into the future.”
