 3. Calls on the NSW Government to extend at least one morning Bathurst Bullet service to originate in Orange, providing a direct, early-morning commuter rail link from Millthorpe and

- Blayney to Sydney Central without requiring a coach transfer.
4. Writes to the NSW Minister for Transport, NSW Minister for Regional Transport and Roads, the Member for Orange, the Member for Bathurst and the Member for Dubbo to request these extensions be prioritised under the state's regional transit planning.
 5. Collaborate with neighbouring councils through the Central NSW Joint Organisation (CNSWJO) and Dubbo Regional Council to leverage regional unity during Transport for NSW's ongoing network investigations.

 - b. Crown Lands have not provided a comprehensive list of assets at Crown Reserve 1031268 (that Council would become responsible for) to enable Council to assess if the proposed transfer of management proceeds,
 - c. From a procedural fairness perspective, 41 days is insufficient notice for Council to;
 - i) Obtain legal advice, and
 - ii) Adequately consider: associated risk and liability, site assets and financial implications if the transfer of management proceeds.
3. That Council write to the NSW Minister for Lands and Property, the Hon Stephen Kamper;
 - a. Outlining Council's strong objection to the proposed transfer and
 - b. Seek an assurance that no transfer will take place until the information sought in 2 above is provided and Council is provided with a fair and reasonable time period to assess, consider and respond to that information.
