Item:

In 2023, Millthorpe Junior Soccer Club registered with a Football Australia initiative called "Club Changer". This year, after the tireless efforts of the club President David Bulter and the committee, they completed various modules and implemented several initiatives, including the Girls Love Football Program (GLF), this earned them a 2-star rating. Building on this progress, Dave Butler submitted a nomination for Millthorpe Junior Soccer Club to be considered for Football Australia's Regional Club of the Year award.

In mid-November, they were informed that we had made it to the top 10 clubs. Tomorrow morning it will be officially announced, and just last week, that the club has been named **Regional Club of the Year Australia!** The committee excited about this achievement.

Club Changer is Football Australia's Club Development Program which aims to protect and enhance our clubs, make them stronger and more resilient, lead them in building welcoming and inclusive cultures, and educate them on positive environments for players, coaches, volunteers, and officials while planning for long term viability and success.
