GLS Parent Workshops

The GLS Parent Workshops are designed to improve parent/carers knowledge about the GLS and to increase awareness about the importance of supervised on road driving practise. Workshops provide supervising drivers with information to best assist them to educate a learner driver in safe driving techniques.

Young drivers are over represented in road crashes. A major report from Sweden found that 'increasing experience as a learner could result in a 15% reduction in the risk of crashing in the first two years of driving'. It is therefore important that we provide as much information, knowledge, assistance and support to supervisor drivers so they can provide well balanced driver training for their learner drivers.

A workshop was delivered in Blayney during November 2016.

Road Safety For Seniors

Road Safety for Seniors aims to provide road safety advice and safety tips to help local community members aged 65 or over make safer choices when driving, riding, walking, using a mobility scooter or catching public transport. This will be achieved by face to face presentations to community senior groups.

Seniors aged 65 years or over are one of the most vulnerable road users groups.

NSW road crash data shows that people aged 75 years or over are three times more likely to be killed in a crash than people in their twenties. This risk increases for people aged 85 or over, who are at least four times more likely to be killed.

A workshop was delivered in Blayney during August 2016.

Plan B

The delivery of this project occurred between November 2016 and February 2017.

The Plan B road safety program aimed to reduce the number of people driving home after consuming alcohol at licensed premises. By delivering road safety messages about the consequences of drinking and driving, Plan B encourages drivers to plan for alternate way of getting home other than driving.

Community Speed Watch

The Road Safety Officer (RSO) attended the Blayney Shire Council Towns and Villages Committee meeting on Thursday 15 September 2016.

Meeting attendees are made up of representatives of individual Shire town and village committees, Council's General Manager and Councillors. The RSO took this opportunity to engage with representatives on the issue of speed in their local communities/villages. Discussion centred on correctly identifying speed, best practises to address the issue and follow up education opportunities. Attendees were provided a timeline where the RSO could work with their villages to address any speeding concerns.

Stepping On

Blayney Health One Outreach Department conducts a Stepping On program for Seniors. The program is delivered over an eight week period with different relevant topics presented each week to attending clients. The RSO attends and presents on the topic of Pedestrian Safety. There can be up to 4 individual programs delivered per annum. This is the fifth year Council has supported this program by was of the RSO's involvement.

Restraint

The RSO is planning a Community Education Day on the correct use of child restraints. Delivery is planned for June.

Safety Around Schools

The RSO and the RMS Safety for Schools Officer are currently working with Blayney Public and Millthorpe Public Schools to improve road safety near the school environment.
