Community Event of the Year - Blayney Shire Horse Sports - Ranch Sorting Event

Blayney Shire Horse Sports held the Ranch Sorting event in January 2021 at the Central West Equestrian and Livestock Centre, becoming the biggest event of its type ever seen in Australia. There were over 1,200 runs over the weekend with over \$17,000 being paid out in prize money for the winning teams.

Ranch sorting involves two riders on horseback sorting 10 cattle numbered 0-9 and one unnumbered cow for a total of 11 head.

As the riders enter the ring a number is called out and they have to sort that one first before sorting the rest in sequence. The unnumbered cow must stay in the ring.

The event attached twice the number of entrances then organisers expected and was a very successful weekend.

Appreciation Award - Martin Farr
