What we've achieved in 2023/24

Accessibility Upgrades

In the last 12 months, amenities at both Carrington Park and Heritage Park have been upgraded with a focus on improving accessibility. The existing Carrington Park accessible toilet has been modernised and a completely new toilet block has been installed at Heritage Park, which includes an ambulant and accessible toilet. Improvements were also undertaken to the building entry of Council, with tactile ground indicators and a larger kick rail on the accessible ramp. At King George Oval two accessible viewing area's have been integrated as part of the grandstand upgrade.

King George Oval Upgrades

This year saw the final upgrades to King George Oval which has been completed through a range of different state and federal grant programs. Over the last two years projects have included a new scoreboard, grandstand seating replacement and handrail repairs, fencing upgrades, new footpaths, new changeroom facilities, and reconfiguration and resurfacing of the carpark.

Special Rate Variation (SRV)

Over the last 12 months, Council has been engaging with the community regarding a Special Rate Variation. The variation is a 10% increase to the general rate for 3 consecutive years, commencing 1 July 2024.

The SRV is needed to assist in addressing the forecast deficits in our Long-Term Financial Plan (LTFP). The SRV will ensure we have financial capacity to maintain the standard of our assets, services and community facilities, including: roads, bridges, culverts, parks, footpaths and buildings.

For 2024/25 (including this rate notice) the 10% increase is only applied to the general rate charge of the rates notice (not the TOTAL amount). Additional charges (such as waste and sewer) have only increased on average by 4%.

The rate increase follows;

- a review of Councils financial position and operations (2022-2023),
- a Community Engagement period (November December 2023),
- review and approval from the NSW Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) (February – May 2024) and
- public exhibition of Councils Delivery Program and Operational Plan (May 2024).

Following Local Government elections on Saturday 14 September 2024, within the first 12 months Council must complete a new Community Strategic Plan (CSP).

The CSP is developed by the community, endorsed by Council and must address civic leadership, social environmental and economic issues. The CSP forms an important reference point for Council to develop annual budgets and operational plans.
